		<b>Applicant's passport valid for at least 4 months</b> , with at least one blank page to affix the visa
		<b>2 Application Forms, one in Spanish (for the embassy) and one in English (for the applicant)</b>
		<b>Two good quality recent color passport photographs</b> on white background
		<b>One photocopy of the data page of applicant's passport</b>
		<b>From Spain:</b> Original and a photocopy of the "Autorización de Residencia Temporal" issued by the "Delegación" or "Subdelegación del Gobierno" of the province of residence of the Pakistani relative who is living in Spain.
		<b>From Spain:</b> Copy of the Spanish residence card of the husband/wife living in Spain endorsed by a "Notario Público".
		<b>Original and a photocopy of the Applicant's Birth Certificate</b> or, in its absence, a sworn declaration of age, legalized by the Foreign Affairs Ministry of Pakistan and subsequently by the Embassy of Spain to Pakistan. Then an authorized translator must translate it into Spanish.
		<b>Original and a photocopy of the Birth Certificate of the wife/husband living in Spain</b> or, in its absence, a sworn declaration of age, legalized by the Foreign Affairs Ministry of Pakistan and

		subsequently by the Embassy of Spain to Pakistan. Then an authorized translator must translate it into Spanish.
		<b>Original and a photocopy of the Marriage Registration Certificate.</b> It must be legalized by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Pakistan and subsequently by the Embassy of Spain to Pakistan. Then an authorized translator must translate it into Spanish.
		<b>Original and a photocopy of the NIKAH NAMA</b>
		<b>Original and a photocopy of the Family Registration Certificate</b> legalized by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Pakistan and subsequently by the Embassy of Spain to Pakistan. <b>ALL THE MEMBERS OF THE FAMILY HAVE TO BE INCLUDED IN THE CERTIFICATE.</b> Then an authorized translator must translate it into Spanish.
		<b>Original and a photocopy of the Police Clearance Certificate</b> issued and legalized by all the countries where the applicant has been living for the last 5 years. It must be legalized by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Pakistan and subsequently by the Embassy of Spain to Pakistan. Then an authorized translator must translate it into Spanish.
		<b>Original and a photocopy of a Medical Certificate</b> stating that <i>“the applicant is not a carrier of any contagious disease, dangerous to public health, in accordance with International Health Rules of 2005”</i> . An authorized translator must translate it into Spanish.
		Travel History (FIA) of the person living in Spain covering the last 20 years <b>(this document does not have to be submitted if the matrimony has got no children or if the wife/husband is travelling with no children)</b>
		If the relative in Spain has been previously married in Pakistan, Spain or in another country, he/she must prove that all previous marriages have been dissolved by submitting the original divorce sentence and a copy.
		<b>From Spain:</b> Proof of Financial Support from the husband/wife living in Spain. It is advisable to provide certificates issued by money transfer enterprises (Wester Union, Ria, Small World, etc.) instead of unreadable receipts.
		<b>Family/wedding photographs</b>
